As your editor, I thought it would be informative to ask our new minister some questions, so here's the first installment of <u>Getting to Know your Pastor!</u> Terry

What is your faith journey?

This is a question potential pastors get asked a lot, but here's the quick and dirty version: I was born and raised Presbyterian, part of a family that was very active in church. My faith was shaped and strengthened by years of Sunday School, youth group, mission trips, fellowship, and worship. I heard my call to ministry in my first year of college, when God revealed to me where my gifts, skills, and experiences might be put to God's service. Despite my initial terror, I soon found that God was giving me courage to answer the call—a sure sign of God's presence in my life. Since then, I oriented my life to follow that call, and sought experiences that would deepen, widen, and strengthen my faith.

What was your impression of KY before you came here?

Honestly, I'm not sure I had much of an impression of KY—I think I thought it was kind of like Virginia, only landlocked! I'm definitely looking forward to discovering what makes Kentucky unique!

What is your family structure?

I'm blessed with a wonderful, supportive family. My parents and grandparents (and a smattering of aunts and uncles and cousins) live in Salem, VA, with more family in California, Pennsylvania, North Carolina, and Florida. My mother is the Director of Development for the Virginia Museum of Transportation, while my father runs the Math Emporium at Virginia Tech. I have one older brother, Robert, who lives in Charlotte, NC and holds two equally cool jobs—as a science educator at the Discovery Place (a children's science museum) and giving ghost tours of the city.

Genealogy? (any note-worthy relatives or stories)

My mother's family has deep roots in Virginia, going back to before the Revolutionary War. That much history is always going to produce some notable names, but probably my most famous ancestor is Alexander Spotswood, who built the governor's mansion that now stands in Colonial Williamsburg and who led the Knights of the Golden Horseshoe on their exploration west of the Blue Ridge Mountains. I guess I've followed in his footsteps, though I've gotten a lot farther than he did!

Are you a city girl, country girl, or a suburbanite?

I've lived most of my life in Salem, VA, which considers itself a small city—about 25,000 people. It's just the right size that when you go to the grocery store, you won't know *everybody*, but you will know *somebody!* Then my college was incredibly rural and my seminary very urban, so I've done a little bit of everything. I'm very happy to be here in Northern Kentucky, where you can get to both the country and the city without too much effort.

How do we reach you?

Okay, so I planted this question, but I want to make sure everyone knows how to get in touch with me. The two simplest ways are by email (pastor.cspresby@gmail.com) or by phone (540-819-4014). You're welcome to call or text; if your call is important and I don't answer, please leave a voice mail so I know what's going on. If you have an emergency overnight (10pm-7am), please call twice in row—I have a setting on my phone that silences those pesky midnight telemarketers, but will let repeated calls through. While not technically in my ordination vows, I promise never to be grumpy if you call me in the middle of the night, so if you are in need of a pastoral presence (or even just a hospital buddy), please call.

I'm still figuring out what office hours will be best for my schedule, but eventually I will commit to being in the office for a few mornings and afternoons a week and will share those times with you. For now, it's best to call my cell phone to make sure I'm in the office if you want to drop by.
