# Seder meal evokes images of family traditions

I remember Thanksgivings when my grandparents, aunts, uncle, cousins, and other family would enjoy a meal of turkey with side dishes that were our traditions. For dessert, we would always have pumpkin, mince and apple pie to choose from.

The adults would gather and reminisce about members long gone of the Cameron, McCance and Thompson families, and retell their stories.

That reminds me of the Jewish holiday of Passover, when families gather to share traditional and symbolic foods during *Seder* meals and to remember the story of the Jewish people and Exodus.

On April 17, Maundy Thursday, CSPC celebrated a Christian *Seder* led by Sarah Cottongim. We read from the *Haggadah*, and had a fellowship meal of traditional Jewish meat and side dishes, a supper like Jesus might have celebrated with the apostles before he was arrested.

*"Haggadah"* is Hebrew for "Telling" and it retells and teaches the Exodus and Passover story to every generation of the Jewish family with a special emphasis on engaging the children. We used a Messianic Passover *Haggadah*, from the Congregation *Shema Yisrael*.

*Haggadah* interprets the story of the Passover, and we learned how that story and that of our Messiah echo one another in God's plan for us. Each step of the *Haggadah* introduces symbols such as *Matzah*, parsley, horseradish and *Charoset*, eaten with prayers of blessing, and their symbolism is explained. Our fellowship dinner consisted of Israeli salads and Hummus, Chicken Soup with *Matzah* balls, Turkey, Beef Brisket, and Leg of Lamb, Roasted Vegetables and Sweet Potatoes. Desserts included Apple Kugel, Macaroons, and Almond Cookies.

## Family Promise suspending shelter programs

In a <u>letter</u> to CSPC and to other supporting congregations, Family Promise suspended the shelter program in Northern Kentucky in which we participated. Family Promise is in ongoing discussions with Interfaith Hospitality Network of Greater Cincinnati, a sister affiliate, to plan for the possible combining of resources, shelters and volunteers. Family Promise relies on grants and donations to remain viable and to fulfill its mission. The current economy has made it even more challenging for groups like Family Promise.
