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# Pastor's Column

My Lord God J have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. J cannot know for certain where it will end. Nor do J really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that my desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope that J have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road though I may know nothing about it. I herefore will I trust you always though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.

This was written by Thomas Merton, a Trappist monk who lived at the Abbey of Gethsemani near Bardstown, KY. It has held great meaning for me and for countless others who have read it, prayed it and committed it to memory. It speaks of the great hope we all share in committing our lives to the God who loves us, sustains us and guides us in all that we do. It reminds me that I cannot be too certain of my own knowledge in choosing my path in life, and to trust in God when I look to the future.

We are about to embark on the next phase of this interim time as we prepare to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). I think it is especially fitting that this work begins as we celebrate Pentecost! We surely must look to the fresh wind of the Holy Spirit as we seek those who will take on this sacred task. If you are asked to consider being nominated for the PNC, or are considering nominating yourself, please consider carefully and prayerfully if this is a task to which you feel called. It is time consuming and can be challenging, but it is also rewarding and so very important!

All of us will need to offer our prayers and support to the PNC once it is elected. The committee may ask us for additional information as they work, and they will certainly need our patient and steady support as they develop the Ministry Information Form and begin to review the materials they receive from ministers who are interested in the position here.

We may not know where this road will lead, but we can be confident that God will be with us as we go.

Rev. Kathy Riley opened the meeting at 7:07 p.m. with prayer and by reading from "Thoughts in Solitude" by Thomas Merton about discernment.

#### Moderator's Time/Docket Building

The agenda was approved by consensus. Under her report, Rev. Kathy Riley:

- Updated session on the Chin community request to use the sanctuary on Sunday afternoons.
- Discussed the need for cottage meetings in April to discuss the future of the church. Rev. Riley said she will ask people who think strategically to help come up with a plan. Members also will fill out surveys and see the Ministry Information Form. The form is used by applicants to learn about the church. The form has 10 characteristics you want in a new pastor. Approval from the Committee on Ministry required to elect the Pastor Nominating Committee.
- Discussed changing bylaws to reduce the number of deacons to six.
- Rev. Riley handed out information on the way to classify churches based on size. She said CSPC was at one time a program-sized church, but now is a pastor-sized church. The next pastor should be involved in committees and know what's going on in the church, serving as the hub of communications..
- Discussed a request to take study leave April 17-24 to attend the annual meeting of the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance as part of the National Disaster Response Team.
- Discussed changing the date of the next session meeting to April 28.
- Approved Motion: To change the date of the session meeting to April 28.

**Approved Motion:** To approve study leave for Rev. Kathy Riley April 17-24 to participate in the National Disaster Response Team (April 17-22) and to go to New Jersey (April 23-24) to work with first responders from Hurricane Sandy.

#### Clerk's Report

- Reported letters confirming a rebate given to the church for members' investments, and detailing mission funds available through PCUSA.
- Recorded session's decision to not offer communion on Palm Sunday or Maundy Thursday during Holy Week.
- Building use request for March 22 from Sheryl Eichelberger to use the gathering room for a wedding shower.
- Approved Motion: To approve the building use form for a shower in the gathering room March 22.

#### Personnel Committee

Members of the personnel and worship committees and session interviewed a candidate for the music director position.

## Building and Grounds Committee

Report on foundation issues at the Western Reserve house that could impact the asking price for the property. Will consult with real estate agent again about the asking price. Also reported a recommendation to put in a gravel or a blacktop pad so new owners could park. Discussed church repairs. The window in the sanctuary was replaced for \$760, offset by donations. Estimates for fixing the water issue in the basement is \$57,900 from Everdry. Bids to be sought on roof repair. The church also needs repairs in the restroom, as well as some HVAC maintenance. **Approved Motion:** Authorize a price as low as \$99,999 for the Western Reserve property.

#### Finance Committee

Monthly financial reports were submitted. The finance committee completed an annual review of the financial records with the help of Ernie Elliot and Mark Boyd to meet requirements of the Book of Order (G-3.0113.) The committee will promote the Kroger Community Rewards program. Dan Alexander, finance chair, will work with Building and Grounds chair Walt Cottongim to prioritize the list, which could cost up to \$380,000. The sale could help fund some of the needed work.
